What is Sanbornton Fire & Rescue?

The Sanbornton Fire & Rescue is a municipal "Combination" department made up of both full time and on call (volunteer) members of the community that respond to over 500 emergency calls for service annually.

During the day the community is protected by two Firefighter/EMS providers that work from 8 am to 8 pm staffing the Central Fire Station.

The on call (volunteer) members respond if available during the day and at night they cover calls from home or sign up for our 8 pm to midnight staffed shift.

Do you have to live in Sanbornton?

We do prefer that you live in Sanbornton, BUT that is NOT a requirement. We only require that you reside within a 15-minute response distance to the Central Fire Station, have the ability to staff the station during the evening shift (8pm to midnight) and have a commitment to serve the community as either a Firefighter or EMS provider or both.

DO I NEED EXPERIENCE?

NO EXPERIENCE NEEDED!!!

The Sanbornton Fire & Rescue WILL train you to either be a Firefighter or EMS provider. All training expenses will be covered and you will be paid while training.

Once certified as a Firefighter 1 or EMT and the completion of a 1-year probationary period, we encourage members to continue their training by advancing to higher levels of certification such as Firefighter 2, Advanced EMT, Driver/Operator, Fire Service Instructor and Fire Officer - All training costs are paid for!

OUR TRAINING PHILOSOPHY

Make sure you are a solid Firefighter or EMS provider before moving up to newer skills.

HOW TO APPLY?

Simply stop by the Central Fire Station at 565 Sanborn Rd during the hours of 7 am to 7 pm and speak to one of the on-duty staff to talk about a position and pick up an application or stop by during one of our Monday night trainings sessions held on the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Mondays of every month starting at 6:30 pm and see what we do.

If you are already certified and have moved into town we can help with reciprocity with the state of New Hampshire.
